OAA in the Curriculum

In response to the recent curriculum review we will explore ways in this workshop that we can make Outdoor and adventurous activity exciting. This will include strategies and games to develop team building, problem solving and building emotional resilience through the outdoors.

Stuff We Can't Say Out Loud

"Stuff We Can't Say Out Loud" is a story-led workshop exploring neurodiversity, emotional regulation and executive-function differences through the lens of children's inner worlds. Using visuals and short extracts from Bren's books, the session introduces simple outdoor-friendly activities — such as "Brain Snapshots" and "Story Seeds" — that help children externalise feelings, build emotional awareness and develop regulation.

All tooled up!

In this workshop we aim to develop your skills in using tools. We will look at the use of knives, saws and other tools to develop curriculum themes and ideas. Through this workshop we will give you top tips to develop your own personal skill level so you feel confident in using tools with children within your outdoor lessons.

National Nature Park

The National Education Nature Park programme empowers children and young people to make a positive difference to both their own and nature's future. Through this workshop you will gain an insight into this free programme which provides all educators with the resources, support and guidance to embed climate and nature into learning in a way that suits your setting and learners and is part of the new curriculum.

SEND in the Outdoors

With SEND needs in schools increasing, this workshop will look at how we can use the outdoors to address the needs of many pupils. We will share with you the findings of our Nurture tribe programme and the positive difference this is making in schools to meet a variety of SEND needs.

Young leaders in the outdoors

Developing young leaders in the outdoors creates a sustainable workforce and creates future ambassadors. We will look at the wild tribe achievement award and the Earth tribe leaders award through this workshop as an example of how to develop young leaders through outdoor learning.
